It's time to mother Earth" Taking Care of Our Bees, by Paul Schroeder, Beekeeper

There is a big difference between native bees and European honeybees. Native bees are often solitary and do not live in hives or colonies. Thus, they are great pollinators but they don't build up stores of honey. This is because the adults do not live through the winter. Only the eggs and larvae survive the winter. these live usually in leaf litter on inside the stems of withered plants. This is why it is a good idea to leave some leaf litter in your garden or a portion of your lawn. Also, leave reeds or stems of plants standing through the winter so you will have native bees in Spring. Honeybee adults do live through the winter so they need lots of honey stored to eat through the winter. Usually 40 to 80 pounds are required for the hive to survive. But that is another story!
