Message

from the PRESIDENT

At its Octtober 20 meeting, Council reviewed the status of the various priority items, briefly summarized below. Specific details will be provided as they are finalized.

- Upcoming fund-raising events include a Dine-to-Donate at Chipotle (Nov. 4, see back for flyer), raffle of a Christmas wall-hanging (created and donated by Sara Ruprecht), and a matching fund campaign.
- Council members will continue to be available on Sunday mornings for questions.
- The "engaging" activity of Christmas caroling (December 13 at 4:30 p.m.) was added to our calendar of events.
- The on-line directory will likely be available by year-end.
- The proposed substantive changes to the Constitution will be explained at the November congregation meeting. To comply with the Central States Synod's approval process, voting on these changes will occur in the spring.
- The first congregation-wide strategic planning session occurred Sunday, October 19. Next steps include analyzing the congregation's thoughtful responses and developing Atonement's values and principles.

Finally, Council handled three routine matters by:

- continued planning of the November congregation meeting agenda;
- approving an updated fee structure for the use of the premises; and
- approving the following holiday worship schedule:

Christmas Eve: Holy Communion services at 4:30 p.m. and 10:00 p.m.

Restricted Funds includes money that was given and set aside for specific purposes such as Capital Improvements, Youth Impact Fund, Memorials, etc. We have significantly dipped into the restricted funds in order to cover operating expenses.

Operating Cash is the money available for daily operation of the church and school such as paying salaries, utilites, insurance, etc. The desired minimum needed to operate Atonement is \$100,000.

The checking account balance as of the last day in the reporting period and the forecasted balance at the end of fiscal year (June 30), based on the Actual and Forecasted Surplus/Deficit thru June 30.

For the period October 1, 2025-June 30, 2026, expenses are forecasted to be \$290,000 higher than revenue. \$190,000 of the shortfall is because OneFund gifts have been trending lower, and school enrollment is less than anticipated. The remaining \$100,000 includes repaying the Line of Credit. The forecasts have been adjusted to reflect these changes.

Revenue generation campaigns are being launched. Details will be provided at or before the November 23, 2025 congregation meeting.
